The Tana Baru was the main burial place for Muslims in the 19th century. So, any Muslim residing in Cape Town who died between 1805 and 15 January 1886 is likely to be buried at the Tana Baru. Tracing your family tree will most likely result in an ancestor of yours being buried at the Tana Baru.

Learning about your family history can have amazing effects on the way you CONNECT with others, especially because it allows you to connect with people in the past, present and future. The Cape Muslim community is particularly rich in this regard, having been here for over 350 years, while interacting with diverse nationalities from all over the world. Didn't you know that your great-great-grandmother who lies buried at the Tana Baru was married to the cousin of the Queen of Holland at the time?
